## **A summer pilgrimage**

My grandson Arthur who will be three in September loves boats. With a piece of old rope he pulls in imaginary boats and ties them up, he creates storms and waves, he rescues people who've fallen in the water and pulls them up to the safety of the sofa. Perhaps his fascination with boats stems from both sets of grandparents being island people. His father's parents live in Shetland and my own family are from Orkney.

David and I were in Orkney in May. We spent time with family and re-traced again the steps of people of long ago who worshipped in sacred stone circles and built mysterious underground tombs. Islands, traditionally only accessible by boat, are often felt to have a quality of otherness; a special place where God can feel more present and where the gap between heaven and earth is only tissue paper thin.

Crossing the sea to stay on an island can offer a sense of escape for us urban dwellers. Here we may find renewal, peace and spiritual refreshment. St Paul sailed to the islands of Cyprus and Malta as he took the good news of Jesus of Nazareth to the Mediterranean world. And I think Jesus had a love for the sea - and boats! Much of his ministry was spent around the shores of the Sea of Galilee. He called fishermen to be his disciples, illustrated the generosity of God with great catches of fish and many times sought escape by sailing out into the Sea of Galilee.

One day, when evening had come, Jesus calls his disciples into a boat and they push off from the shore. They may have been tired at the end of the day; they may have wanted just to go home but they go with Jesus. A storm blows up and they are afraid. Jesus stands and says 'Peace! Be still!' The disciples are filled with awe. If they had not had the courage or commitment to go with Jesus they would not have had this awesome, life changing experience. Jesus Christ calls each one of us to travel with him too.

Sometimes that means leaving the security of what we know and pushing off from the shore; for Jesus wants not just to accompany us but to transform our lives.

As we look forward to a new journey together I pray we will be inspired by the wind of the spirit blowing through our lives.

However, the continuous running of our community café will only happen, in the long term, if we have more volunteers who are willing to give two hours a week of their time on a regular basis and there are more volunteers who could stand in for holidays and emergencies.

We have vacancies because two volunteers have found it necessary to give up and as the majority of the current volunteers are in their 70s and 80s it could well be that more of the team will find it necessary to give up too.

We need someone who could help on Wednesday mornings, 10.30-12.30 and we may well need two volunteers on Monday afternoons for the 12.30-2.30 slot in the near future. There are not necessarily many customers at these times but if we are to remain open every day there is this urgent need for more staff.

This is our main form of outreach so let's do our best to keep it going.

## **‘FROM STONES TO WATER’**

Daphne Brown of St Neots Methodist Church (our contact in connection with this Project) writes:

“Life in Zimbabwe is hard. I have some friends who are out there at the moment and there is no electricity where they are living and food is very expensive. When I go I feel I take from my friends as they need to feed me etc. also Diesel is so expensive it is hard for my friend Ketani to drive around checking the borehole sites for me.

I am 81 next week and have been walking with crutches for 12 years now due to a mistake in hip surgery, and so I have to be careful. On my last visit when the plane was delayed for 24 hours in Nairobi, I was left in a wheel chair in a car park at 4.00 in the morning because I could not get into the mini buses provided to take us to a hotel!! I eventually got there but it made me realise how vulnerable I am travelling on my own. I just feel that after 20 years God is quietly saying the time has come to stop at Christmas, I am still raising money for a final borehole until then.

Through people like yourselves at Beckenham, God has enabled me to put around 40 (I have lost count!) boreholes in villages and schools, it has been an amazing privilege and I am so thankful”.

## **Vice-President of the Conference 2015/2016**

Speaking to the Conference at her inauguration in June, Dr Jill Barber questioned ‘Where is the Methodist voice?’ Jill suggested that through a renewed focus on the four ‘P’s of Prophecy, Prayer, Passion and Protest, Methodism can find its voice, speaking out to make a difference and speak more effectively whilst embracing its distinctiveness and diversity.

Introducing her theme Jill said, “Part of the problem of course is that we don’t and can’t speak with one voice. The strength of Methodism is that it is a democratic movement of people, with many different views about how we should work out our Christian discipleship. But we can’t stay silent. God calls us to speak out. It is not easy grappling with how to live with contradictory convictions, but that is our calling.

. . . I want to call on Methodists to get involved in local and national politics. To become a voice for change, challenging the politics of self-interest and upholding the politics of the common good.”

## **STEP FORWARD**

In September, the Wednesday evening Class Meeting will begin using a resource called 'Step Forward'.

## CHURCH DONATIONS

Two particular donations made from church funds to local, national and international charities this year are as follows:

**The Leprosy Mission** received £2,000 for their FEET FIRST project. This will be doubled through the government's UK Aid scheme. Feet First will work with 4,000 ultra-poor people in Mozambique. Leprosy-caused nerve damage can lead to terrible deformities and even amputation. But through foot care groups, which help people to protect their numb feet and, by providing protective sandals, leprosy-affected people will be spared the wounds and ulcers that can lead to permanent disability. This means that people affected by leprosy can remain mobile and independent able to look after themselves and not reduced to a life of begging.

**World Vision** received £1,000, which becomes £5,000 through the UN World Food Programme. This will feed 12 families for 6 months.

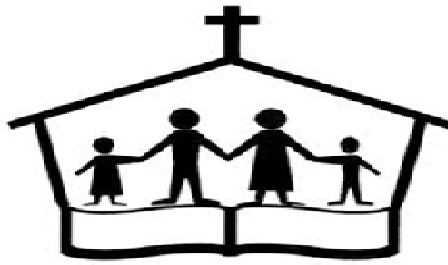

## **GARAGE MATTERS**

The Property Team would like to bring readers up to date with matters concerning the garage premises attached to the church. The garage site was purchased in the 1960s by the late Mr. Rob Copeland who then gave it to the church to enable the church to extend its activities when it felt the time was right. A seven year lease was granted in 2007 to the current tenants who were setting up in business together for the first time. The business has grown successfully and also acquired the use of premises in Lewes Road Bromley. In the church's opinion the business has outgrown the building at the rear of 12-14 Bromley Road which was built and designed as a small scale operation.

Due notice was given to the tenants in February 2014 that the lease would not be renewed after 31st August 2014 as the church now wished to use the building for its own purposes which initially entailed storage of equipment used by our uniformed organisations and for our own archives and maintenance equipment as well as a base for collecting tools and equipment recycled by the charity Workaid which is supported by the church.

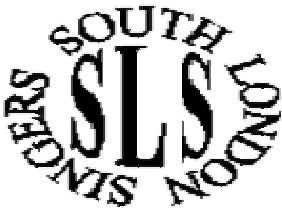
The garage directors issued a counter claim in the County Court to oppose the ending of the lease. The Judge found in favour of the church as landlord and awarded costs to the church as well as refusing to allow the directors an appeal. Leave to appeal the court decision has since been granted by the Court of Appeal in London.

Meanwhile the church applied for planning permission for change of use from Business Class B1 to Community Use D1 to take effect once the tenants had vacated the premises. This would enable better use of our existing premises which are already extensively used by over 40 different community groups. The application was turned down by Bromley Council who took no account of the potential community use which is equally a part of their UDP alongside the support for local businesses. The Church appealed to the Planning Inspectorate on the grounds that their application had not been properly considered and the Planning Inspector has now overruled the Bromley Council decision and planning permission for Change of Use to D1 has been allowed.

The garage proprietors' case in the County Court rested solely on the refusal of the planning permission arguing that the church would not be able to use the premises as intended. The Judge found that this was not so as the church intended to use the building for storage which was already allowed under the existing planning Use Class Order.

A future aspiration was to be its use for church activities if and when planning permission was granted. Now that that planning permission has been granted, the tenants' argument has collapsed and we hope that the tenants will find alternative premises in order to be able to continue to operate and that a date will be agreed for the surrender of the premises. The tenants have already had 17 months to find a suitable alternative site but have not made great efforts to do so believing that they could somehow remain in the current building which belongs to the church.
